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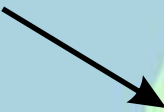
Lincoln Park

Lincoln Park:

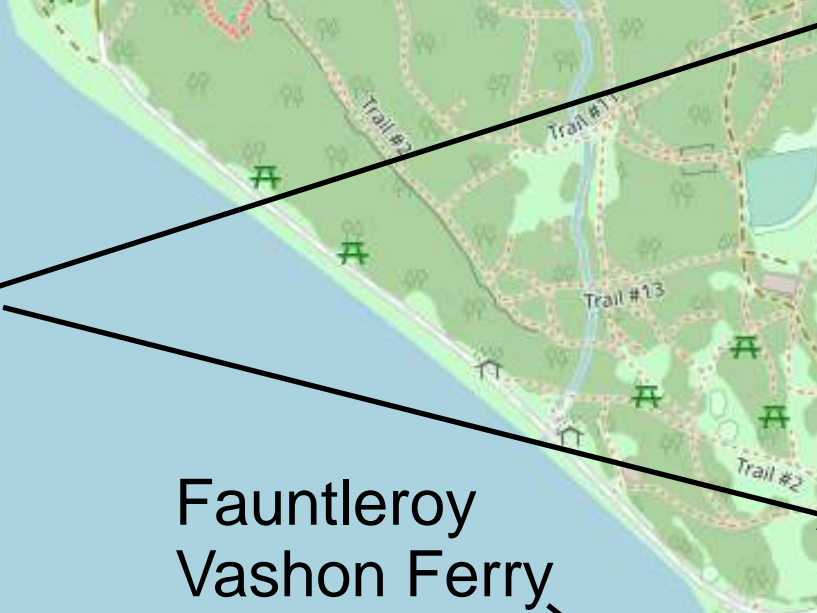
The sight of Seattle's only Olympic size saltwater pool. originally in 1925 a tidewater filled pool. Back then the fire department was deputized as stand in pool man and periodically hosed out the mud and debris that collected. Back then it was called Lincoln Pool. In 1941 the pool was rebuilt with tile bottom, pumps and filters and no longer needed the fire department's help. Current regular swimmers will notice the subtle but noticeable buoyancy of the salt water when swimming.

The park is almost a mile long and has a network of trails throughout including beach walking along the waterfront and some wonderful forest trails in the south end near the picnic area. The best parking is off Fauntleroy Way (8011 Fauntleroy Way SW, Seattle), there is no parking in the park itself.
