Seward Park;
The park plan was developed by the famous Olmsted Brothers in the early 1900's the landscape firm that designed Central Park, Yosemite Valley and Harvard University. The park was purchased in 1911 and named after William Seward (Pres.Lincoln's Secretary of State). There are numerous trails throughout the isthmus, a fish hatchery on the NE side and frequently nesting eagles in the inland forest groves. The park is about a mile long with restrooms on the northeast end. Best parking is on the south end of the park (5900 Lk Wash Blvd. S)
